### Introduction:

This "Technical Bulletin" from Speight, Marshall & Francis, P.C. is the second of a series discussing the topic of Special Inspections. It should be understood that Special Inspections is only applicable to the building portion of projects and does not include sitework testing and inspections.

This "Technical Bulletin" has been written to define our procedure for handling Special Inspections on the Contract Drawings.

## **Contract Drawings:**

The contract drawings should outline which specifications sections will fall under the auspices of Special Inspections. We do this in our "General Notes". Our typical "General Note for Special Inspections is as follows:

THE WORK UNDER THE FOLLOWING SPECIFICATION SECTIONS IS SUBJECT TO SPECIAL INSPECTIONS AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 1705 OF THE BOCA NATIONAL BUILDING CODE, 1996.

02200 - EARTHWORK

02360 - DRIVEN PILES

03300 - CAST-IN-PLACE CONCRETE

03410 - STRUCTURAL PRECAST CONCRETE

04200 - UNIT MASONRY

05120 - STRUCTURAL STEEL

05220 - STEEL JOISTS AND JOIST GIRDERS

05310 - STEEL DECK


05400 - COLD-FORMED METAL FRAMING

06100 - ROUGH CARPENTRY

06192 - PREFABRICATED METAL-PLATE CONNECTED WOOD TRUSSES

## **Specifications:**

The specifications are used to define what aspects of the work will fall under Special Inspections. The front end of the specifications should clearly state the financially responsible party for the Special Inspection services (typically the owner). The drawings and specifications must be fully coordinated.



## **Statement and Schedule of Special Inspections:**

The Structural Engineer of Record is the most qualified member of the project team to develop the Statement and Schedule of Special Inspections. Both forms are mandatory requirements for the Contractor to receive a building permit for the project. The Statement contains information regarding the design team, Contractor, and general information regarding the project. The associated schedule of Special Inspections defines the extent of the inspections required. It specifies the Special Inspector and Testing Agency or Agencies and their responsibilities.

Further "Technical Bulletins" will discuss the Special Inspections specification section-byspecification section and clarify the roles of all parties involved.



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
